An Introduction from Headmaster, Leo Winkley

The arrival of the national holiday of Thanksgiving over in the United States coincided with news this side of the pond of the tier system that comes into force when the current English lockdown ends on 2nd December. We know that Shropshire will be in Tier 2 which means we continue to operate very much as we have been over recent weeks. The various limits and controls have been sensibly adopted and become the 'normal for now': a matter of habit. Learning, performing, creating, sharing, socialising – all these things and many more have proved possible, just in new and different ways. Some things remain beyond us: the affinity that draws Shrewsbury pupils and staff together still holds strong, but at a stand-offish distance that feels distinctly un-Shrewsbury. We like eating together; we enjoy idle chat in mixed aged groups; we prefer to be able roam free. These things will return in time. And, even within the normal for now, there is so much about daily life that is unaltered.
