### SCHOLARSHIPS FOR AWARD

Up to 10 Music Scholarships are awarded annually. Within the Music Scholarship, we also offer specialist Choral and String Scholarship awards. The majority of Music Scholarships carry fee remission of 10%, although awards of up to 30% remission can be made. Music Scholars receive free tuition on two instruments. (Choral Scholars receive free singing tuition only.)

### CONDITIONS

Candidates must be registered for entry into the Third Form in September 2022. Please contact the Admissions Office on **01743 280552** (email: [admissions@shrewsbury.org.uk](mailto:admissions@shrewsbury.org.uk)) for a Registration Form if you have not yet registered your son or daughter for Shrewsbury School.

The winner of a Music Scholarship must also reach a satisfactory standard in Common Entrance, the Academic Scholarship Examination or Shrewsbury School I3+ entrance examination before entering the School.

Music Scholars hold their awards for five years, provided that their conduct and progress are satisfactory, and that he/she continues to contribute fully to the School.

### ASSESSMENT

Candidates are required to perform on two instruments, or one instrument and voice. Candidates should normally prepare two contrasting pieces, each not exceeding 5 minutes in length, for each instrument or voice. [NB – candidates for Choral Scholarships may choose to be assessed only on voice.]

The general standard on the first instrument is normally at least Grade 6, but promise and potential is as important as actual achievement. There will be sight-reading tests appropriate to the performing standards in each instrument, and aural tests will also be given.

All candidates will be asked questions of a general musical nature, and candidates must also satisfy the Music Faculty of their enthusiasm and commitment to music. Additional skills such as ability in the field of composition will also be taken into account.

Keyboard accompaniment to pieces should be brought when candidates attend for examination and examples of the candidate's compositions or theory work may also be offered.
