



# I3+ SIR MICHAEL PALIN ALL-ROUNDER SCHOLARSHIP NOTES

## Sport

- The candidate must offer two sports from the following list in which to be assessed.
  - Athletics, Cricket, Cross Country, Fives, Football, Hockey (girls), Lacrosse, Netball, Rowing, Rugby, Tennis
- Each candidate will undertake a variety of fitness tests alongside assessments in their chosen sport.

## Music

- The candidate should nominate either one or two instruments on which to perform (this may include the voice). They should perform a selected piece of no longer than four minutes on each instrument, and will also be given some listening tests. The candidate will have a conversation with the Director of Music about his/her musical interests and ambitions.

## Drama

- The candidate should present a monologue (not exceeding two minutes in duration).
  - *The candidate may also choose to offer a dance piece (in addition to their monologue).*
- There will be a group workshop exercise.
- The application form will ask candidates to state their previous drama experience.

## Art

- There will be a practical drawing examination lasting one hour.
- Candidates should submit **a digital portfolio of 6-10 JPEG images** by Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September 2021. These should be sent to [admissions@shrewsbury.org.uk](mailto:admissions@shrewsbury.org.uk). The images should demonstrate the artistic ability, creativity and breadth of processes offered by the candidate in both 2D and 3D. Please ensure the work has been photographed well under suitable lighting, and they are good quality high resolution images.
- On the day of the interview, candidates must bring **one final outcome or a current sketchbook** that they feel summarises or exemplifies their own way of working.

## Design & Technology

- Candidates will undertake a 30 minute aptitude test to examine their design and communication capabilities. The paper will set design problems, and pupils will be expected to sketch and communicate solutions to these problems. The test examines the clarity of communication; a creative approach; and an ability to sketch, to consider the function/use of products and to acknowledge suitable materials and construction techniques.
- Candidates are required to bring a portfolio of work that will evidence their ability in Design & Technology. The work could exemplify any design-related activity, either in or out of school, but should demonstrate appropriate breadth of experience. Please note that large practical items need not to be brought, but should be appropriately photographed as evidence in the portfolio.

## TIMINGS ON EVALUATION DAYS

Once the deadline for the applications has passed, we will construct an individual programme for each candidate for the two days. Both the candidate's school and his/her parents will be informed of the timings. Candidates who are due to board at Shrewsbury may be accommodated overnight. Prospective day pupils should be collected at the end of their commitments on Sunday and delivered back to school on Monday morning.
