Exam Leave

In order to help candidates to prepare effectively for public examinations, Shrewsbury makes a period of 'Examination Leave' available to all pupils in the 5th and 6th Form. The precise dates will vary from year to year depending upon the timetable laid down by the public examination boards. During this period, pupils have the choice of working from home or they can choose to remain in school and work from their house.

Fifth Form

- Normal Timetable runs through to the end of lessons on Friday 23rd May (start of Exeat).
- Examination Leave commences on Monday 2nd June. Thereafter, all boarders taking examinations must be in school by 9.00 p.m. (at the latest) on the evening prior to any paper being sat.
- During this period, those faculties with examinations still outstanding will schedule subject-specific revision sessions.
- All Fifth Formers are to be back in School on Monday 16th June at 9.00 p.m. (dayboys Tuesday 17th June at 8.25 a.m.) through to the end of term. Those pupils taking GCSE Latin will have one exam remaining; usual school examination conventions will apply.

Lower Sixth

- Normal Timetable runs through to the end of lessons on Saturday 10th May, at which point Examination Leave commences. Thereafter, all boarders taking examinations must be in school by 9.00 p.m. (at the latest) on the evening prior to any paper being sat.
- All Lower Sixth pupils are to be back in school on Tuesday 3rd June at 9.00 p.m. (day pupils Wednesday 4th June at 8.25 a.m.) for the post-AS programme.
- A small number of examinations take place once the post-AS programme has commenced; usual school examination conventions apply.

Upper Sixth

- Normal Timetable runs through to the end of Friday 23rd May. There are some examinations prior to this; usual school examination conventions will apply.
- Examination Timetable commences on Monday 2nd June. Lessons cease at this point.
- Home Leave (written permission required) and Speech Day arrangements to be negotiated by private treaty with Housemasters.
- School commitments to be fulfilled, as far as is reasonably possible, prior to Home Leave being agreed.
- A programme will be available for any Upper Sixth pupils who wish to remain in school after their final examinations.

N.B. Individual arrangements should be discussed with Housemasters.
