Dear Parent,

I am delighted that your daughter will be here next term and we are looking forward very much to welcoming her to Shrewsbury. This is a vibrant and friendly community and we will do all we can to ensure that she feels a valued part of it as quickly as possible.

By now your daughter's Housemistress will have written to you to explain various elements of routine, so that you can begin to 'tune in' to House life, which is so central to the Salopian experience.

Since the Housemistress, supported by the House Matron and a team of tutors, has over-all responsibility for the welfare of the members of her House, it is with her that you will be most closely in contact, and she is your first port of call when questions arise. There may, however, be occasions when you have concerns or issues that you would like to discuss directly with the Headmaster, in which case please do not hesitate to contact my PA to arrange a meeting.

The **Fasti**, our school calendar, is published on the school website (www.shrewsbury.org.uk) and will be sent to you at the start of each term. In it you will find the dates of concerts, plays, sporting fixtures, lectures and Chapel Services. Do please understand that you are most welcome to attend any of these occasions. We greatly value the opportunity to meet parents and hope you will enjoy excellent contact with the school. **Dates Ahead**, including Exeats and the extended weekends, are enclosed so that you are able to plan your year in advance.

The **Yellow Card** covers issues to do with Welfare. It sets out on paper a framework of encouragement, expectations and rules, which we will go through with your daughter shortly after arrival, ensuring that she feels secure in her knowledge of how we operate. If there is any aspect of the card which you wish to discuss, then your daughter's Housemistress will be only too happy to talk to you. We realise that no single document can hope to cover everything and we are well aware that the greater part of our life at Shrewsbury depends on mutual trust, honesty and common sense.

I would also refer you to the Statement of the School Ethos.

The school has a wide range of documentation available on its website, including the following:

You should know, too, that any correspondence you may wish to direct to the Chairman of the Governing Body (Mr Tim Haynes) may be sent to him at the school address.

Finally, I would like to draw your attention to the important information from the Deputy Head (Academic), which I would urge you to read carefully. This includes a booklet offering advice on choosing GCSE subjects. In future years other academic subject choices will be taken at various stages in your daughter's career – concerning Sixth Form subjects, for example. Full information will be sent to you at the appropriate time in preparation for those decisions. (With regard to passage into the Sixth Form, you may wish to know that we will expect pupils to achieve at least 5 GCSE passes at grade 5 or above). I also enclose a statement about our Learning Support Department and also our policy for pupils for whom English is an Additional Language.

My colleagues and I very much look forward to future opportunities to meet you, as your son progresses through what we hope and expect to be an enjoyable, challenging and successful time at Shrewsbury School.
