

- ✿ Play an active role in the pastoral life of the School, supporting pupils as a tutor
- ✿ Contribute to the co-curricular programme, from sport and outdoor activities to music, drama or community engagement

You will be fully supported and mentored as you develop your skills and confidence in the classroom.

Interview Stage

If you are invited to interview, you will be asked to bring:

- ✦ Proof of your right to work in the UK
- ✦ Original evidence of your qualifications
- ✦ Three forms of identification (full details will be provided in advance)

Many of our Fellows go on to:


- ✦ Progress into formal teacher training (including PGCE and School-based routes)


