As Tracy Island and its colourful cast celebrate their own 60th anniversary this year; their ethos, international articulacy, speed and capacity to respond to calls to action, are values mirrored and evidenced in the individual and philanthropic actions throughout our own global community of alumni, parents, friends and supporters in this, our own, 60th anniversary year of the Shrewsbury School Foundation.

Independent schools remain reliable barometers of the economy, and despite the political shear, we are humbled and heartened by the loyalty and generosity of our donors, standing with and strengthening our School in its work: enabling and enhancing the lives of our pupils. 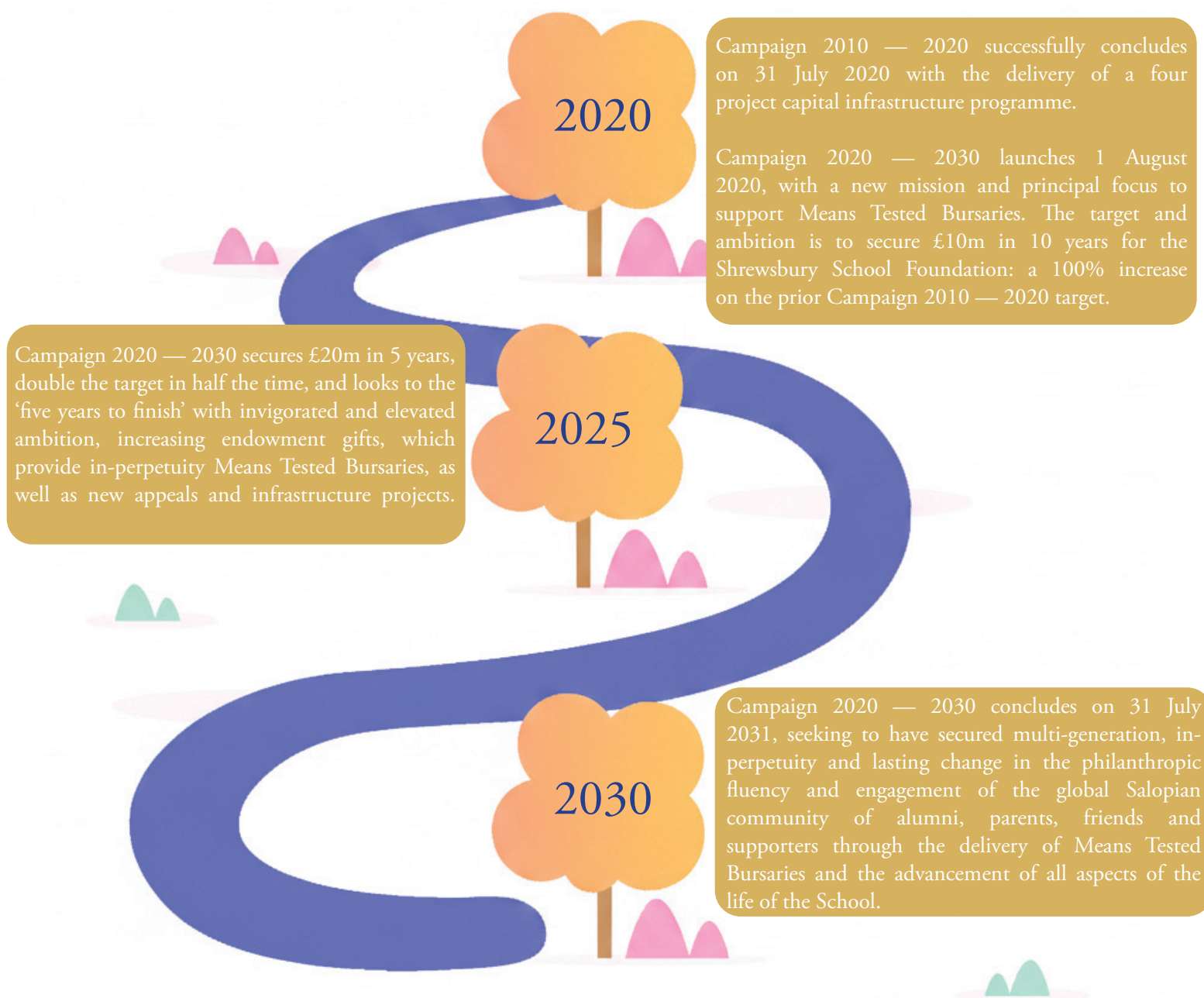
Campaign 2020 — 2030

A Vision For Shrewsbury's Future

With its auspicious founding by Royal Charter in 1552, and subsequent identification as one of the 'Great' Public Schools by the Clarendon Commission in 1868, it should come as no surprise that the foresight of the School brought about the establishment, on 18 May 1965, of the Shrewsbury School Foundation. It is thought to be the first such charitable foundation associated with a British Independent School, and to this day, the Foundation exists to create, support and enhance the provisions of Shrewsbury School, including its commitment to the provision of Means Tested Bursaries.

Following the success of last year, we were humbled by the generosity of our donors, enabling us to raise even more this year, and serving the aspiration to increase the number of young people attending the School who would be able to take full advantage of the unique opportunity a Shrewsbury education can provide, were it not for their financial circumstances.

Fundraising continues to form a vital part of the School's capacity to deliver its mission, influencing positively a number of the School's strategic objectives to 2030. Our Ten Year Global Advancement Strategy: Campaign 2020 – 2030, is ambitious, with a focus on supporting Means Tested Bursaries, whilst also welcoming some new projects alongside each year.





Five Years to Finish

We are presently directing support towards three funds

1. The Means Tested Bursary Fund

Provides means tested fee remissions to suitably qualified pupils with the appetite, promise, and academic ability to benefit from a Shrewsbury education where their personal and family financial circumstances would otherwise preclude their attendance.

2. The Infrastructure Fund

Provides contingent or contributory support to the costs associated with the creation, adaptation or enhancement of the buildings, tangible and physical infrastructure and environment of the School.

3. The School's Current Area of Greatest Need Fund

Provides flexible support attendant to existing and emergent need throughout and across the full range of initiatives in Campaign 2020 – 2030 and the life of the School. Donations to The Family Development Fund are routed to this fund, unless donors specify otherwise.

Giulia (Upper Sixth, The Grove)

Coming from Bristol, I used to travel nearly an hour each way to my Rowing Club, which made balancing training with School a real challenge. I started looking for a place that could combine strong academics with high-level rowing, and Shrewsbury School has been exactly that.



With most schools focusing on girls' sports like netball and hockey, Scholarship & Bursary Programmes for girls' rowing are quite rare, so I've been incredibly grateful for the opportunity to study and train here at Shrewsbury School and with the Royal Shrewsbury School Boat Club (RSSBC). Being able to integrate rowing into my timetable has made such a difference, and I've met some truly brilliant people through the Boat House and School life.

A real highlight was racing at my first Henley Royal Regatta (HRR) in the Quad, an unforgettable experience that has inspired me to keep pushing in the sport as I look ahead to studying English Literature at university.

Max (Upper Sixth, The School House)



The Margaret Cassidy Scholarship for Sporting Excellence has allowed me to grow both as an athlete and as a person. Before joining Shrewsbury School, I trained at Rob Roy Boat Club in Cambridge. In 2024, after competing at the National Junior Indoor Rowing Championships, I was approached by the RSSBC, who invited me to consider developing my Rowing and Academic potential at Shrewsbury School.

This has been a truly life-changing experience. The coaching and teaching at the School and its Boat Club are, in my view, the best in the country. The staff consistently guide us through setbacks and successes, helping us balance demanding training with academic work. The facilities are fantastic, and rowing in high-performance boats gives a competitive and psychological edge.

Representing the RSSBC at HRR has been an unforgettable highlight. More importantly, Shrewsbury has taught me leadership, interdependence, and resilience. Qualities that I believe helped me earn the role of Captain of Boats, which is a great honour.

Without the generosity of this scholarship programme, I would not have accessed the education, coaching, and opportunities offered here at Shrewsbury School. The support and encouragement I've received from the school community gives me the determination to aim high as a Rower, and in my career ambition of becoming a commercial pilot. I am grateful for the belief shown in me by the School and know that this experience at Shrewsbury School has opened doors to me for an exciting future.

Willa (Lower Sixth, Mary Sidney Hall)

The Scholarships & Bursaries Programme at Shrewsbury School has enabled me to pursue my passions in Sport with access to incredible facilities and coaches. My main sports are Hockey and Netball, and the new pitches and courts which were opened this year have really elevated our game and improved our competitive edge as a team. Working in the strength and conditioning suites with specialist instructors has also improved my understanding of how to train to give best match performance. Shrewsbury School has facilitated my growth both as an athlete and in the classroom, and has given me countless opportunities to meet other like-minded people that share the same interests as me, as well as others who have skills and interests different to my own, which have helped me to grow as a person.

Will (Lower Sixth, The School House)

Joining Shrewsbury School in the Sixth Form as a Rowing Scholar was an amazing opportunity and a huge chance for me to work at my Academics and Sport. Since starting, the sheer number of experiences provided to me has been incredible, and I feel really honoured to be here. The amazing facilities, fantastic Boathouse, and beautiful River Severn coupled to the teaching and coaching is exceptional.



Even though this is only my first Term at the School, I have already been to several races, and have been pushed to work harder than ever before. I have really valued the sense of support, teamwork and unity that there is at Shrewsbury School.

Representing the School, rowing at the Junior Fours Head built a shared hope for the season ahead in the squad, and our prospects for both the National Schools' Regatta and HRR as we progress this year.



Sienna (Fifth Form, The Grove)

With the help of the Scholarships & Bursaries Programme, I came to Shrewsbury School from Slovenia, where I have lived for 10 years.

Shrewsbury has given me the whole boarding experience and it has been incredible. Prior to coming to the School, I had never done any sort of boarding for longer periods of time, and it has allowed me to create friendships with so many people who are now very good life-long friends.

This is my 3rd year at Shrewsbury, and it has provided me with so many opportunities, across academics and the co-curricular life of the School. Receiving a Sports Scholarship from the III Form, it has had a massive impact on my life. I have participated in a large range of sports including some I have never played before (Hockey, Netball, and Fives), and all of which I have come to love.

Tennis is my main sport, and I have been able to play throughout the whole year with the School's wonderful facilities and all-weather surfaces. I am very grateful for the ability to play year round, and the extra sessions I can take which enable me to carry on improving my game.

It is my hope to go on to university in The United States of America, and with the possibility of applying for a Tennis Scholarship, as well as continuing to contribute to a range of sports.

My experience at Shrewsbury School has been wonderful and has enabled options for my future I could not have anticipated, I am so grateful.

Coming from the local area, I am so grateful to Shrewsbury School for the Bursary which has provided an opportunity and education I otherwise would not have had. 60th Anniversary Fundraising Telephone Campaign

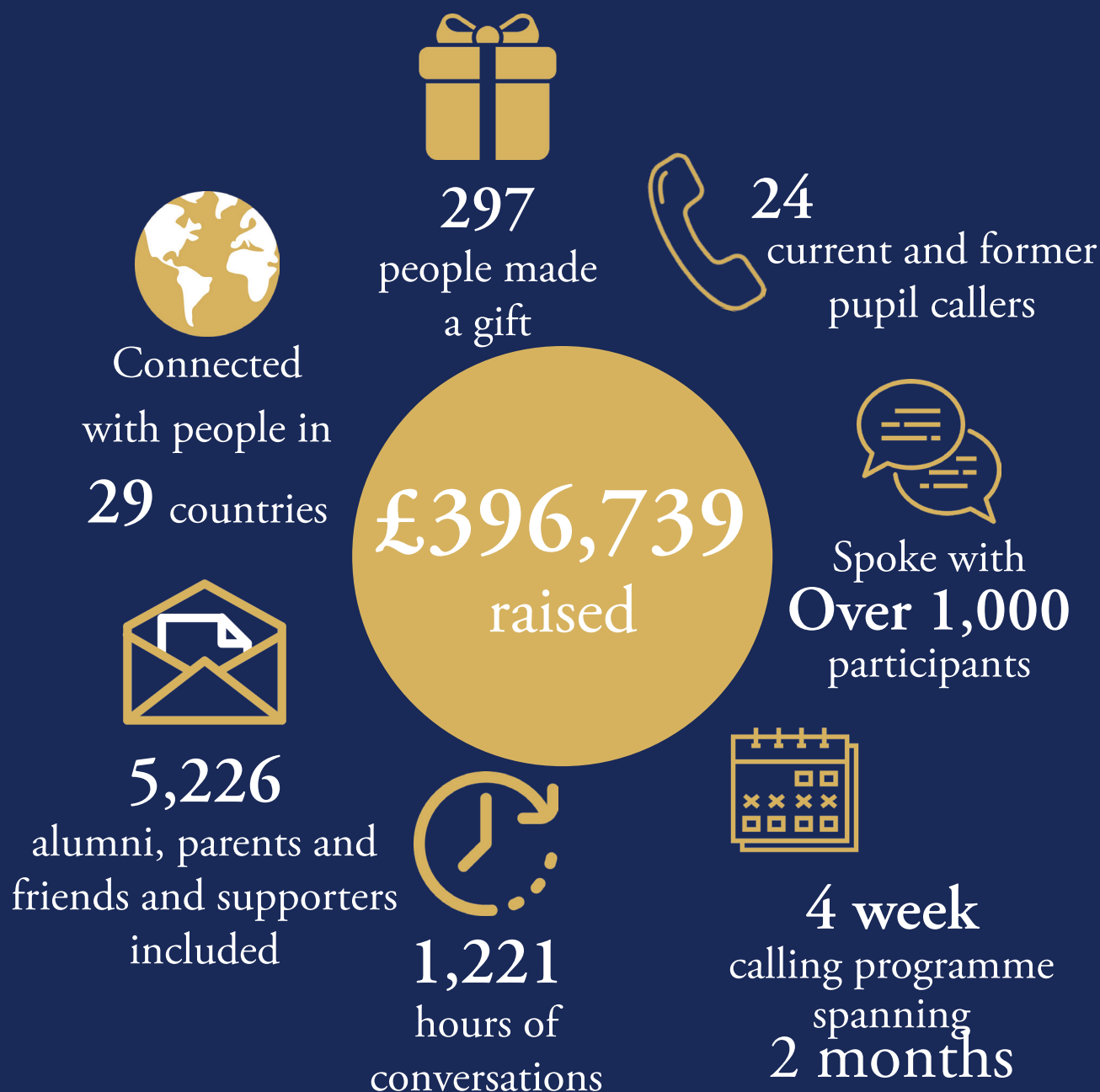
As part of our celebrations and activities for the 60th Anniversary of the Shrewsbury School Foundation we undertook another record-breaking Fundraising Telephone Campaign, which raised £396,739 for the 60th Anniversary Appeal.

This outcome has smashed our target by 127% and also represents a 131% greater yield than any prior Fundraising Telephone Campaign in the School's history. We also have retained (since 2020) Shrewsbury School's position as the number 1 UK Independent School for this type of activity and have again broken all our own prior records.

In October 2025 we were externally nominated for a national award in recognition of our work in this area, and we retain and remain the national record holders for six consecutive years for this type of activity.

We extend our unreserved thanks to every member of our global community who engaged with the programme and made a gift. This is your success, and is the power of *The Salopian Spirit* in action.

Your Estate can also pay Inheritance Tax at a reduced rate of 36% on some assets if you leave 10% or more of its 'net value' to the Shrewsbury School Foundation in your Will (the net value is the Estate's total value minus any debts).

We recognise legators during their lifetime through membership of The 1552 Legacy Society, so called in recognition of the School's year of foundation by Royal Charter.

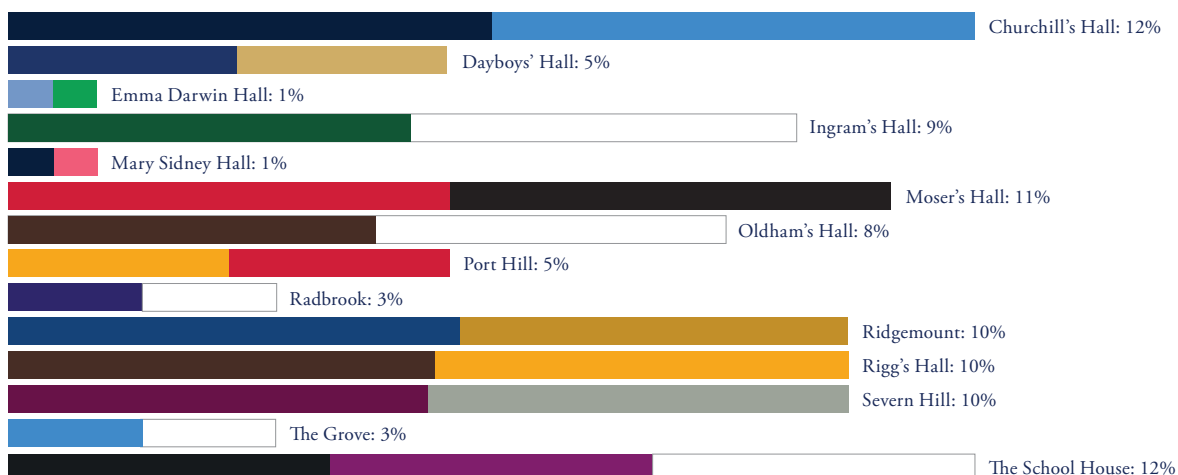

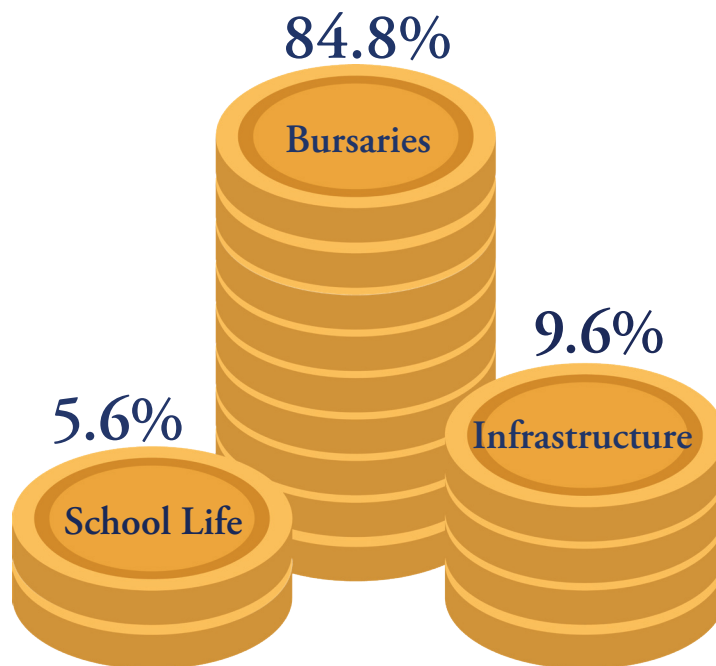

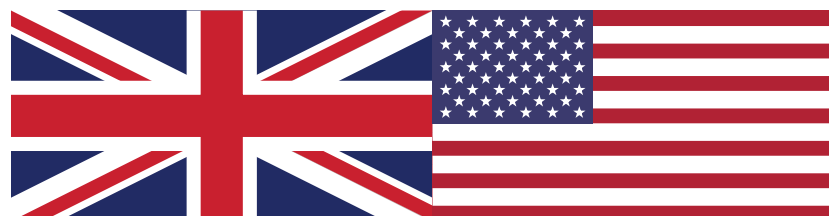

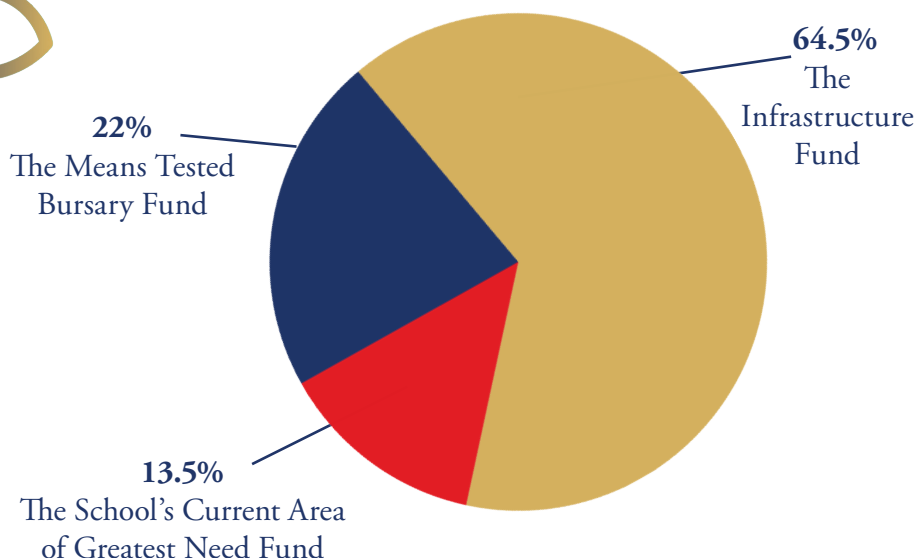

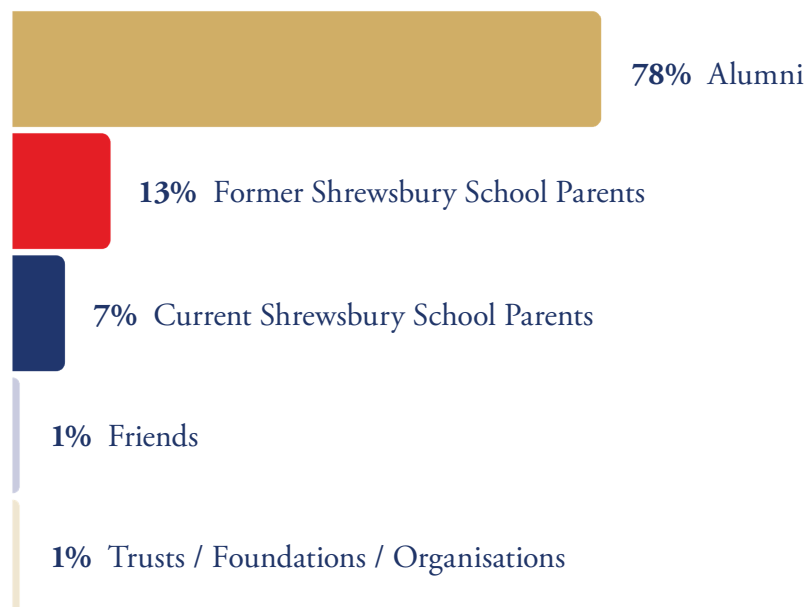

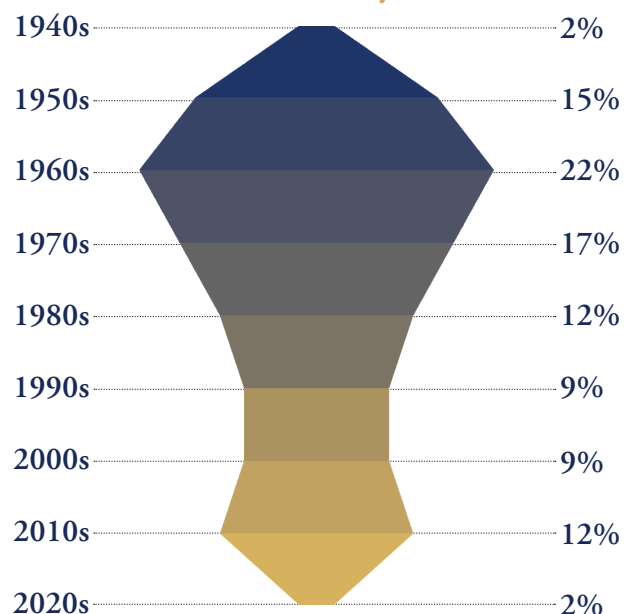
Direction of Gifts

Alumni Donors by Decade

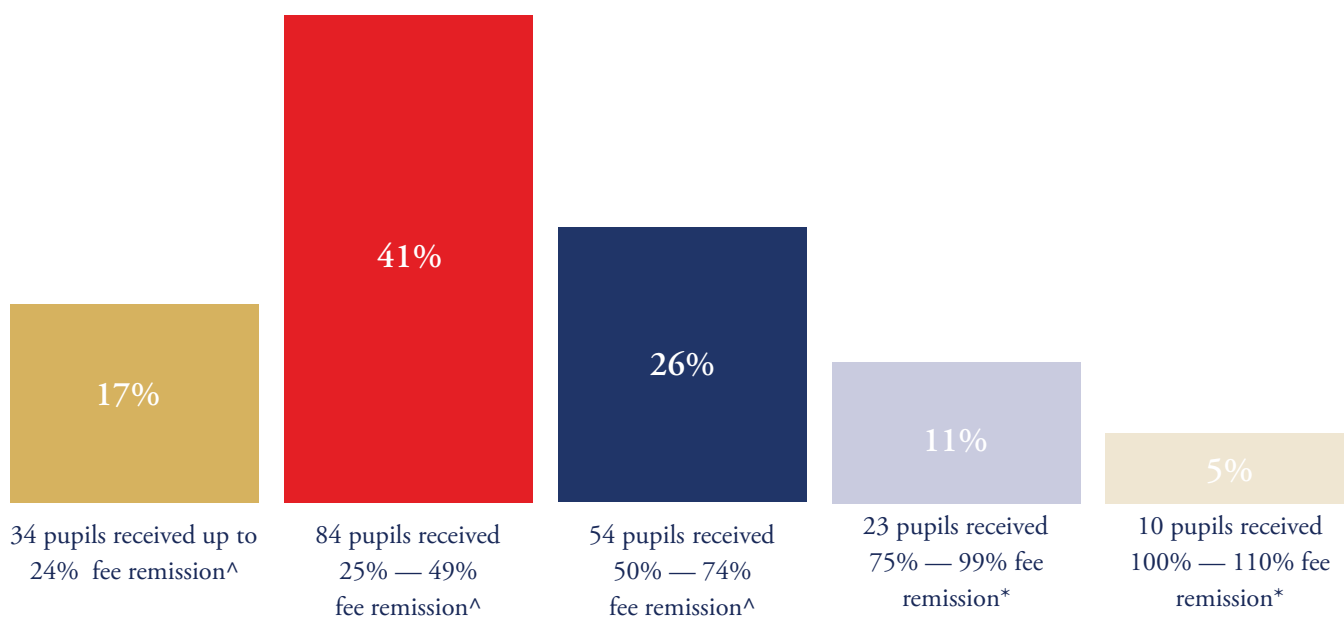


The School awarded Scholarships and Means Tested Bursaries worth £4.99 million to 372 recipients during the year



205 (55%) of these were Means Tested Bursary recipients who received 77% of the funds (£3.82 million) distributed in the form of fee remission awards.

167 (45%) of these were Scholarship recipients, who received 23% of the funds (£1.17 million) distributed in the form of fee remission awards.

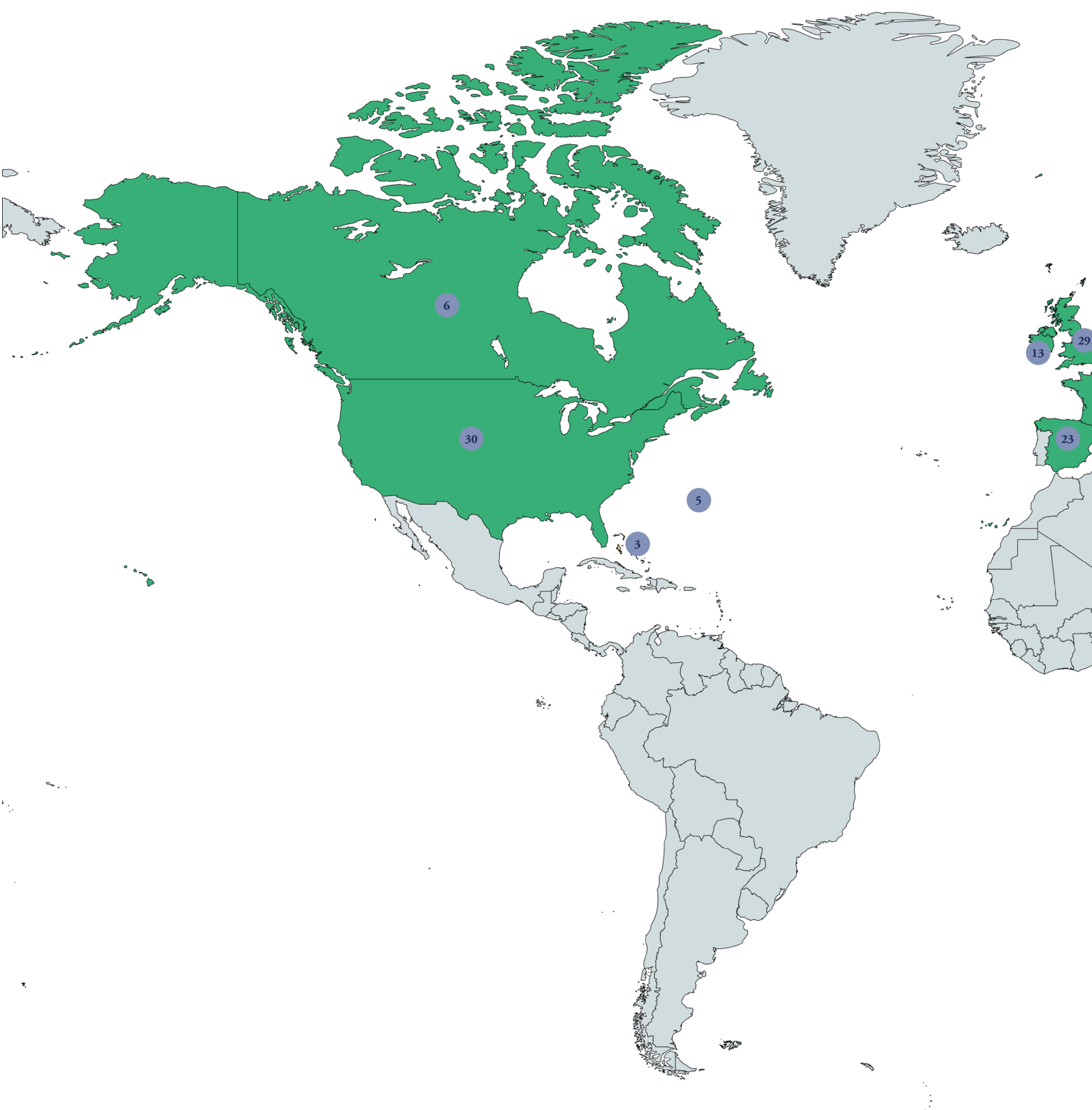

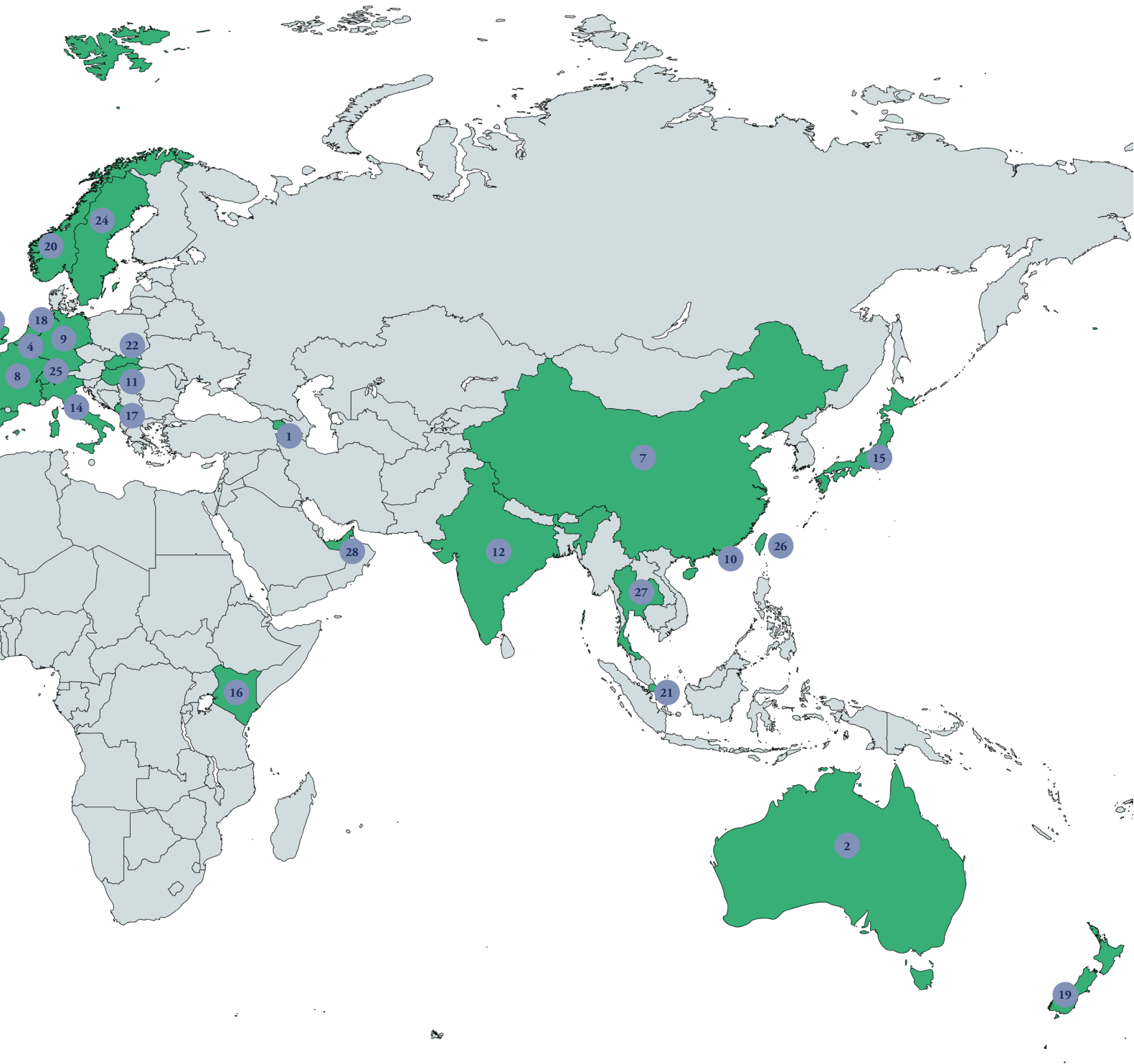
