





Shrewsbury School Foundation was created by Trust Deed in 1965 in order to promote, foster and advance charitable purposes associated with Shrewsbury School. Since then it has assisted Shrewsbury School financially by raising funds to provide bursaries for pupils who could not otherwise afford the fees, and for prioritised capital projects aimed at keeping the school at the forefront of independent education.

In the 2017-18 financial year the Foundation primarily raised unrestricted funds and funds for bursaries as part of the Annual Fund. In addition, the Foundation focused on the fourth capital project in the Headmaster's 20/20 Vision, the reimagining of the Ashton Theatre.

Funding of all four exceptional facilities, namely the Hodgson Hall academic block, the Chatri Design Centre, the redevelopment of the Moser Library and now the Ashton Theatre, could not have been accomplished without the generous leadership of our donors.

With these vital capital projects funded, the Foundation will once again focus on building up its bursarial provision. We are keenly aware of the cost of private education and are reminded by recent focus groups that bursarial support is a priority for both parents and Old Salopians.

In this report you will read about the achievements of the Foundation during the 2017/18 fiscal year and see a list of those who have generously contributed. You will also see the names of those in our community who have made provision in their will for Shrewsbury by joining our 1552 Society. Please can I ask you to bear the Foundation in mind for your charitable giving? Whether your gift is large or small, all charitable contributions make a huge difference to Shrewsbury School.

In closing, I would like to say what an honour it is to serve as your new Chairman and I look forward to working closely with the Foundation staff, our new headmaster Leo Winkley and the Salopian Club to further our Foundation's development. Thanking our donors

It is important to the Foundation that all those who make a gift are recognised for their support. All gifts combined make a real difference and benefit teaching and learning at Shrewsbury School. Our donors enable capital projects to be completed and pupils who could not otherwise afford the fees, to be educated here.

Giving Societies

Our Annual Giving Societies were created to acknowledge donors' generosity based on their contributions over a financial year. All donors are given the option to have their name appear in our donor listings:

Moss Society – up to £250 Kennedy Society – £250-£999 Butler Society – £1,000-£4,999 Ashton Society – £5,000 or more.

Many of the Foundation's loyal supporters have given over a longer period of time and so the Foundation has also created cumulative giving societies to recognise their commitment based on their lifetime giving:

Member: total giving £1,000 or above **Fellow:** total giving £10,000 or above

Charter Fellow: total giving £50,000 or above Founder Fellow: total giving £100,000 or above Benefactor: total giving £250,000 or above Patron: total giving £1 million or above.

Those who have given £10,000 or more will be invited to have their name added to the donor wall, which is in the foyer of the Alington Hall.

Events

Donors are invited to events during the year to thank them for their generosity. Depending on the level of giving, the Foundation holds receptions and openings, offers tickets to the School Carol Services, holds dinners for Fellows, and invites donors to sporting events such as Henley and also music and theatrical events.

1552 Society

The I 552 Society was formed to enable the Foundation and Shrewsbury School to thank those who have made provision for Shrewsbury School in their will. To recognise their support all members of the Society are invited to an annual event at the school and receive a specially commissioned lapel pin.

By leaving a gift in your will you can help Shrewsbury School to invest for future generations. All legacy donations, large or small, make a real difference and can enable the donor to support causes dear to them in a way that they couldn't during their lifetime. As Shrewsbury School Foundation is a registered charity, leaving a legacy can reduce the amount of tax payable on your estate.

Membership of the 1552 Society is offered to all those who let us know that they are remembering Shrewsbury School in their will. There are currently just over 100 members, and in 2017-18 the Foundation received just under £35,000 in legacy gifts.

Summary of Annual Giving 2017-18

Each year the Foundation is tasked with raising at least £550,000 for the Annual Fund. In 2017-2018 £554,696.92 was raised in cash gifts and new pledges (excluding funds raised for the Capital Campaign). Old Salopians, parents and friends gave primarily to support the following areas:

Bursaries: Donors generously supported the Headmaster's Bursary Fund which directs bursary funds to where they are needed most, covering up to 100% of fees. Donors also supported several named bursaries and bursaries directed to pupils in particular Houses.

Unrestricted gifts: Gifts to the Whole School Fund are allocated to the area of greatest need as determined by the Headmaster and Governors.

Projects: Donors gave to projects such as the Hunt, Shrewbury House, rowing training, and items for use in boarding houses. In addition to Annual Fund projects, donors gave generously to Shrewsbury's Capital Campaign projects.



Capital Project – The Ashton Theatre

Six years ago Shrewsbury School charged the Foundation with the responsibility of funding an ambitious four phase infrastructure improvement plan. The fourth phase of this plan is a dramatic multifunctional performing arts centre. This wonderful new facility will replace the existing Ashton Theatre that has served us well since being converted from the old gymnasium in the 1980s. Construction of this exciting project will commence in the summer of 2019.

Not only will this outstanding new facility meet the needs of a growing dramatic arts curriculum at Shrewsbury but it will be so much more. Our new centre will be a focal point for many and varied school activities.

By the end of the 2017-18 financial year, the Foundation had secured the bulk of the funding for this much needed project. Shrewsbury School extends to all those who are playing their part in funding our new theatre a heartfelt thank you. Undoubtedly this facility will make a marked impact on teaching and learning at Shrewsbury School.






The Annual Fund in 2017-18









