Aims and objectives

The Shrewsbury School Foundation has now been raising funds to support Shrewsbury School for 50 years. Its main aims are to provide bursaries for qualified, means tested pupils, with over forty current pupils being supported by the Foundation, and to fundraise for prioritised capital projects undertaken by the school.

At present the Foundation is continuing with a drive to raise funds for the third of five capital projects enabling the school to implement our 20/20 Vision plans to improve the school's infrastructure as agreed by the Headmaster and Governors.

From the Chairman

For a number of years now the Foundation has been publishing an annual report. The purpose of this is to provide our supporters and the larger school community with a transparent account of our accomplishments. I am pleased to say that once again the Foundation has achieved much of what it set out to achieve. Just over a year ago our capital campaign total stood at £2.4 million. We have now raised over £3.9 million. At the same time our annual programme raised £649,326, with the vast majority directed toward bursaries.

2014-15 was a very important year for the Shrewsbury School Foundation. In 1965 a number of Old Salopian leaders came together and wrote a trust deed that would form the backbone of Shrewsbury School's Foundation. If it was not for their forward thinking all the great achievements of the Foundation would not have transpired. In fact if these Old Salopians hadn't come together in support of the advancement of teaching and pupils at Shrewsbury School the building blocks would not have been in place that would allow the modern day Foundation to consider let alone complete a £10,000,000 campaign. It is therefore important on our 50th anniversary that we remember those who have worked selflessly to lead our world class school financially.

As with every independent school thanks must also go to those within our community who respond to the value in supporting teaching and learning. The simple fact is that fees alone have never covered the cost of a Shrewsbury education. In this modern era fees increasingly have been seen as a barrier for many parents. This is why for years the Foundation, with the support of Old Salopians and parents, has provided tens of millions of pounds in bursarial support to ensure that the best and the brightest means tested pupils can still gain access to Shrewsbury.

As we conclude our 50th anniversary year I would like to thank all those people listed at the end of this report, who stand with the Foundation in the advancement of our great school, for without their financial support Shrewsbury School would not be where it is today.

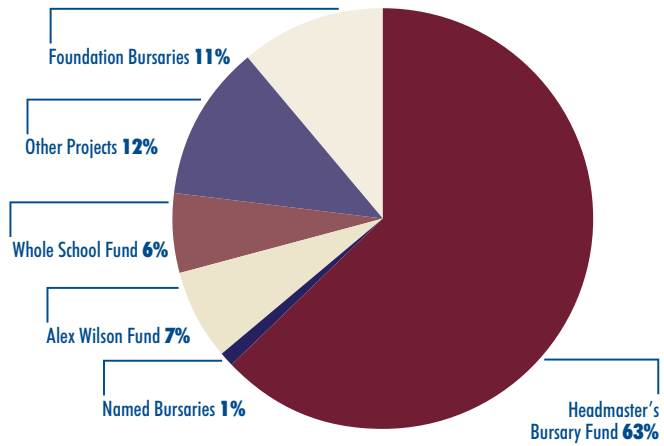

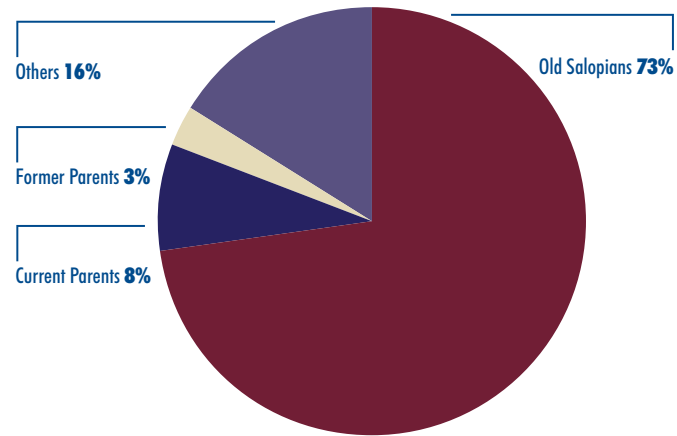
Summary of Giving 2014-15

Direction of Gifts

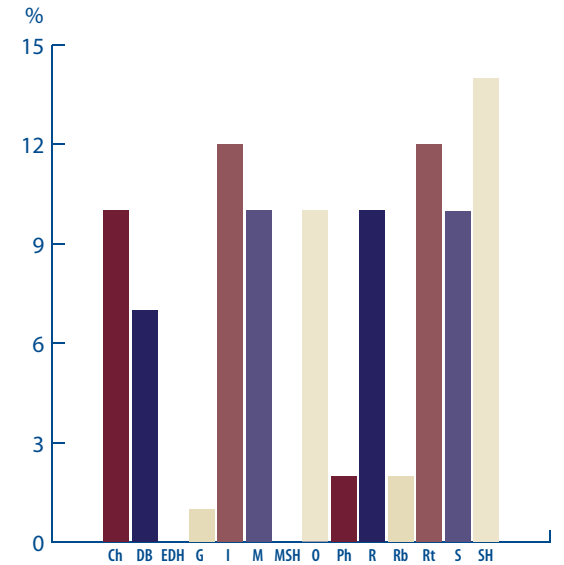


**Pledges and Donations

Current Project



Funding was secured for the redevelopment of the Lyle Building by the end of the 2014-15 financial year, and work began in July 2015. Its completion is due by the start of the 2016-17 academic year and is eagerly anticipated by the Design and Technology, and ICT and Computing Faculties who will benefit from the improvement to their facilities.

It will be named the Chatri Design Centre, after the lead donor.

Annual Fund

There are three main strands to the Annual Fund to which support can be directed. These are:

Foundation Bursaries which provide bursarial support for pupils in a particular house

The Headmaster's Bursary Fund which provides bursarial support for pupils in general

The Whole School Fund which supports areas of greatest need as determined by the Headmaster and Governors.

Together they have helped maintain Shrewsbury at the forefront of education.

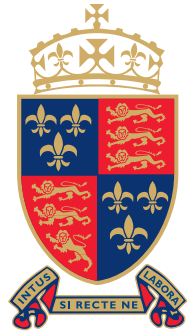
