Shrewsbury School Foundation has been raising funds to support Shrewsbury School for over 50 years, making it the longest established school development office in the UK. Its main aims are to raise funds for bursaries for pupils who could not otherwise afford to attend the school, and for prioritised capital projects designed to keep Shrewsbury at the forefront of independent education.

The Foundation is currently engaged in funding the essential capital projects outlined in the Headmaster's and Governors' 20/20 Vision plans.

In 2013 our Headmaster Mark Turner penned a road map for Shrewsbury School entitled the 20/20 Vision. There were three pillars to his strategic plan. As we look back to the heady days of 2013 we can see what a resounding success the 20/20 plan has been.

In terms of the redevelopment of Shrewsbury's infrastructure a five phase plan was initiated. Hodgson Hall was opened on Old Salopian Day 2015. This year the Chatri Design Centre housing Design and Technology, and ICT and Computing was opened. At present the Foundation is in the midst of funding the redevelopment of the Moser Library and after that we will turn our sights to the Ashton Theatre and a Sports Centre. These are exciting times for Shrewsbury School and the Foundation and with the generous support of Old Salopians and parents we can and will achieve our goals.

As the Foundation continues to work to provide the best facilities for our teachers and pupils please be reminded that all the facilities that you benefited from or your child is enjoying came from the benefaction of supporters just like you. If it were not for those who support bursaries for qualified means tested pupils or essential capital projects, our great school would look very different. As you ponder this fact I ask that you consider making Shrewsbury School a charitable priority so that we can continue to be the School you expect and deserve.

# The Annual Fund

The Annual Fund provides ongoing support for the School's bursarial and development plans that cannot be funded through admission fees or commercial activities. The generosity of Old Salopians, parents and friends is essential in enabling the Foundation to continue to assist with the School's priorities. In 2015-16 our donors supported the Foundation's three main areas which are:

**Foundation Bursaries** – bursarial support up to 50% of fees for pupils in a particular house.

**The Headmaster's Bursary Fund** – bursarial support directed to where it is most needed, up to 100% of fees.

**The Whole School Fund** – unrestricted gifts are allocated to this fund and directed to the area of greatest need as determined by the Headmaster and Governors.

In addition, in 2015-16 some gifts were directed towards small projects, and activities such as the Edinburgh Festival, music equipment, a lecture in art history and coaching for the Hunt, among many others.

## Giving Societies

Gifts to the Foundation in any given year are provided with membership of our Annual Giving Societies:

**Moss Society** (up to £250)

**Butler Society** (£1,000-£5,000)

**Kennedy Society** (£250-£1000)

**Ashton Society** (over £5,000)

The Foundation also recognises all donors through cumulative giving societies:

**Member** – total giving £1,000 or above

**Fellow** – total giving £10,000 or above

**Charter Fellow** – total giving £50,000 or above

**Founder Fellow** – total giving £100,000 or above

**Benefactor** – total giving £250,000 or above

**Patron** – total giving over £1 million

Those who have given £10,000 or more are eligible to have their name added to our donor wall, which is located in the foyer of the Alington Hall.

## Events

The Foundation hosts a number of events throughout the year to recognise and to thank those who give so generously to the Foundation. Depending on the level of support, giving society members will be invited to Shrewsbury School Speech Day, Fellows' Dinners, Drinks Receptions, Henley and bespoke events. In addition our supporters are invited to sporting, musical and theatrical events.

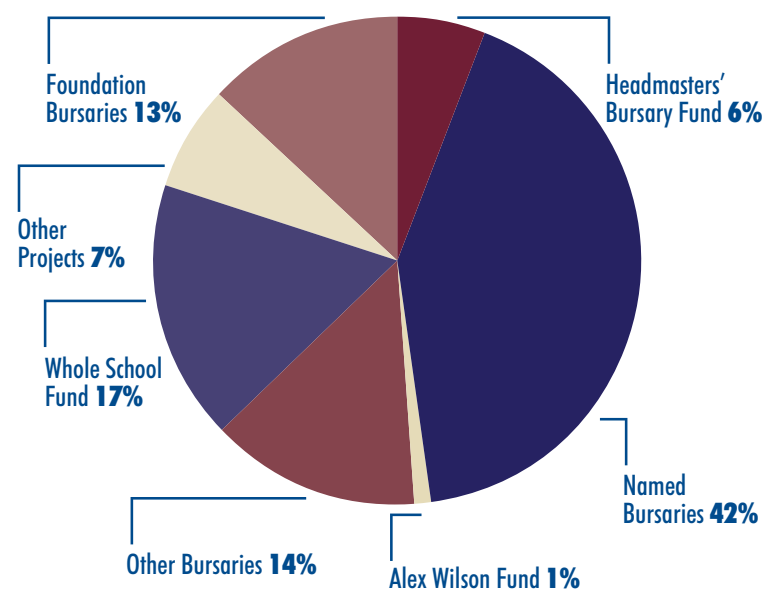
## The 1552 Society

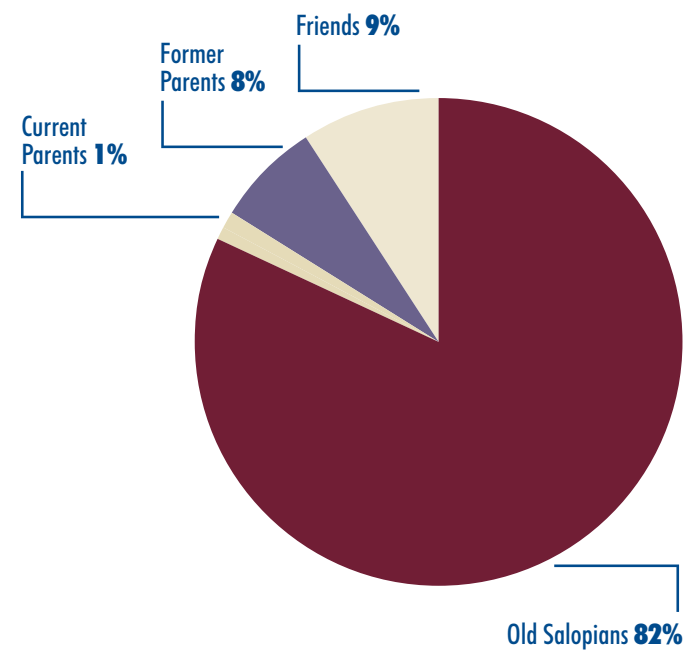


# Summary of Annual Giving 2015-16

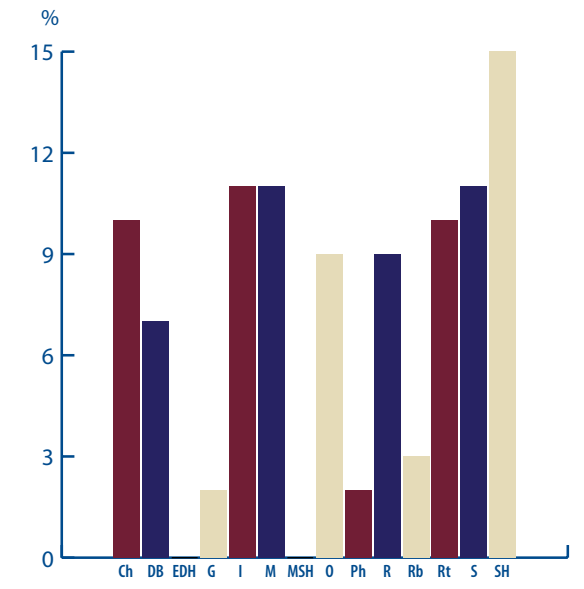
## Direction of Pledges & Donations

## Legacy Giving

Currently, just under 100 Old Salopians have let us know that they plan to leave a legacy to the school in their will, and over the past ten years, the Foundation has received over £2.7 million in legacies. Whatever the size of your legacy, it will truly be appreciated.

## Telephone Campaign

The Foundation's annual telephone campaign raises much needed funds for bursaries and other important projects at Shrewsbury School. It also provides an excellent opportunity for Old Salopians and parents to talk to sixth formers and recent leavers and find out about the latest news and developments at the school. Over the past ten campaigns the Foundation has raised an amazing £1.5 million.

In July 2016 we raised a fantastic £152,000, which was mainly directed to bursaries and the forthcoming refurbishment of the Moser Library. Over a three week period our 14 callers spoke to 884 parents and Old Salopians in 27 countries.





## Providing Bursaries

Bursaries continue to be one of the Foundation's fundraising priorities, allowing pupils who could not otherwise afford the fees, to receive an education here. In 2015-16 funds raised by the Shrewsbury School Foundation directly supported 41 pupils.

Past bursary holder, Awen Blandford looks back on her time at Shrewsbury School.

"School life was so rich: sporting, artistic, social, on top of the rigorous academic disciplines of day-to-day life, living in the supportive atmosphere of the staff and girls of EDH. I am currently undertaking a BMus in Performance, studying the cello at the Royal Northern College of Music, Manchester.

Taking up the myriad opportunities offered at Shrewsbury School, helped me to gain confidence as an individual and musician. Those years were, above all, an enriching experience: they have enabled me to further pursue my musical interests, and gave me the requisite skills and confidence wherewith to continue to improve my musicianship. Those precious years were a privilege accorded to me through the generosity of others – for which I shall always be grateful".

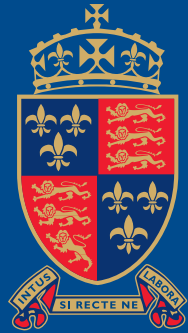
