From the Chairman



It is the time of year when I write to the Shrewsbury community to provide you with an insight into the productivity of the Shrewsbury School Foundation in the last fiscal year. Before I run the numbers I would like to say how grateful I am that so many parents and Old Salopians chose to join me in supporting Shrewsbury in 2016/17.

Over the years the Shrewsbury School Foundation has always made bursaries for qualified means tested pupils who otherwise could not afford a Shrewsbury education an emphasis of our work, and this year is no exception. I am pleased to say that in the last fiscal year the Foundation increased its annual goal by 10% and met it. For those that partnered with the Foundation, raising £632,831, please accept Shrewsbury School's gratitude for your support. Your charitable contributions in support of bursaries truly attract outstanding pupils who help shape the Shrewsbury experience for all.

As I am sure you are aware the second aspect of the Foundation's work is its contribution to outstanding capital projects that provide our pupils and teachers with the finest of teaching and learning facilities. In 2016/17 the Foundation completed the Moser Library, the third project in our Capital Campaign, and it was opened to much fanfare on Old Salopian Day 2017. It is tremendous to see that so many Old Salopians and parents received and responded charitably to the timeless message that says "Shrewsbury School was built, is maintained and only bettered through our community's charitable giving". The facilities that you benefited from, or that your child enjoys, are a gift from others in our community. Together we keep Shrewsbury strong.

In 2017/18, the Foundation is moving on to its next project, the long overdue refurbishment of the Ashton Theatre, which is an essential fixture in the Shrewsbury experience for parents and pupils alike. Once completed it will enjoy a grand foyer, a sprung dance floor, new seating, green rooms, a costume store, and advanced sound and lighting. For centuries Shrewsbury has excelled in the performing arts and as such if you haven't supported our first three capital projects I ask that you consider, in a way comfortable to you, making a gift, perhaps over five years towards this vital project. It is only through the combined might of our entire community of parents and Old Salopians alike that we are able to maintain Shrewsbury's position as an elite school worldwide.

The Annual Fund

In 2016-17 £632,831 was raised in cash gifts and new gift pledges for the Annual Fund. Old Salopians, parents and friends gave primarily to support the following areas of activity:

Foundation Bursaries: bursaries which can provide up to 50% of fees for a student in a particular House.

Headmaster's Bursary Fund: bursarial support directed to where it is needed most covering up to 100% of fees.

The Whole School Fund: unrestricted gifts are allocated to this fund, which supports the area of greatest need as determined by the Headmaster and Governors.

In 2016-17 donors also gave to various small projects and activities including support for Classics, and provision of music equipment.

Giving Societies

It is important to the Foundation that all donors are recognised for their support. Donors to the Foundation are given membership of our Annual Giving Societies for their total contributions over a financial year:

Moss Society – up to £250

Kennedy Society – £250-£999

Butler Society – £1,000 to £4,999

Ashton Society – £5,000 or over

Donors' lifetime giving is also recognised via the Foundation's cumulative giving societies:

Member: total giving £1,000 or above

Fellow: total giving £10,000 or above

Charter Fellow: total giving £50,000 or above

Foundation Fellow: total giving £100,000 or above

Benefactor: total giving £250,000 or above

Patron: total giving £1 million or more.

All those who have given £10,000 or more in total will be invited to have their name added to the donor wall in the Alington Hall.

Events

Shrewsbury School Foundation is tremendously grateful to all its donors for their generous support. Together they enable students who could not otherwise afford the fees to be educated at Shrewsbury, and many capital projects would never have been completed without their assistance. Events are held throughout the year to thank those who have given so generously. Depending on the level of giving, the Foundation hosts receptions and openings, offers tickets to the School Carol Service, holds dinners for Fellows, and invites donors to sporting events such as Henley, and also music and theatrical events.

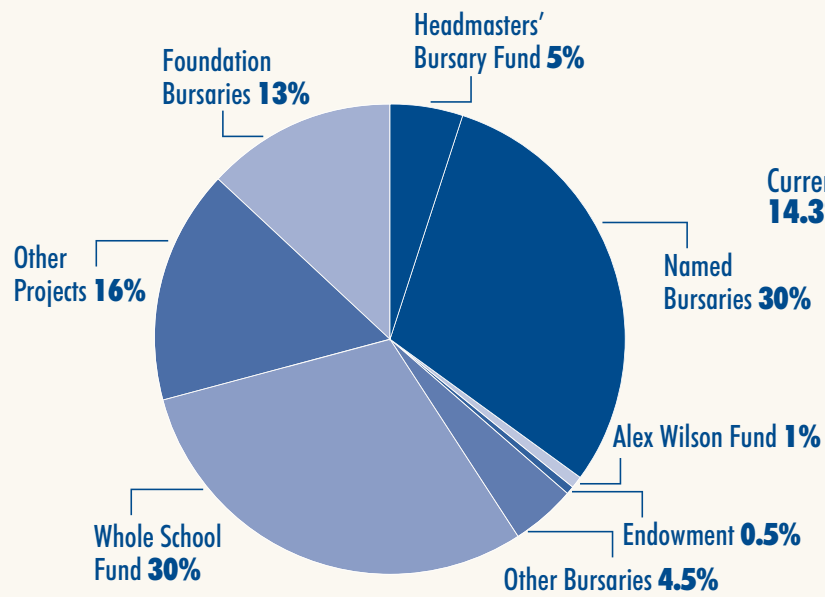
The 1552 Society

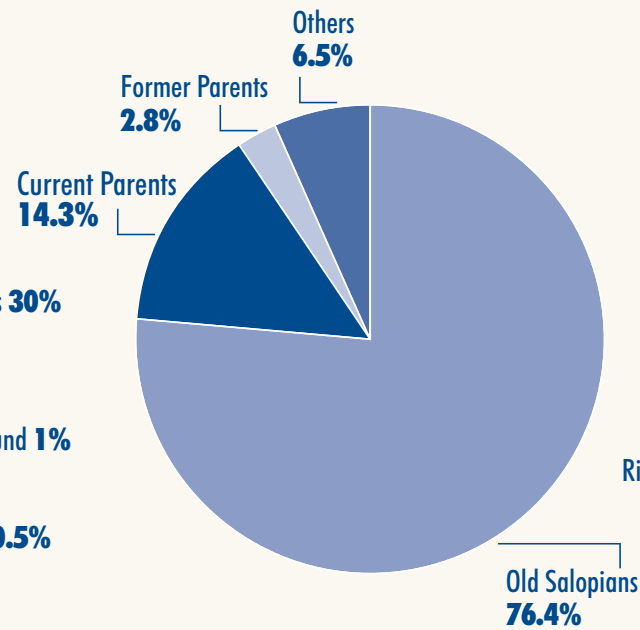


Summary of Annual Giving 2016-17

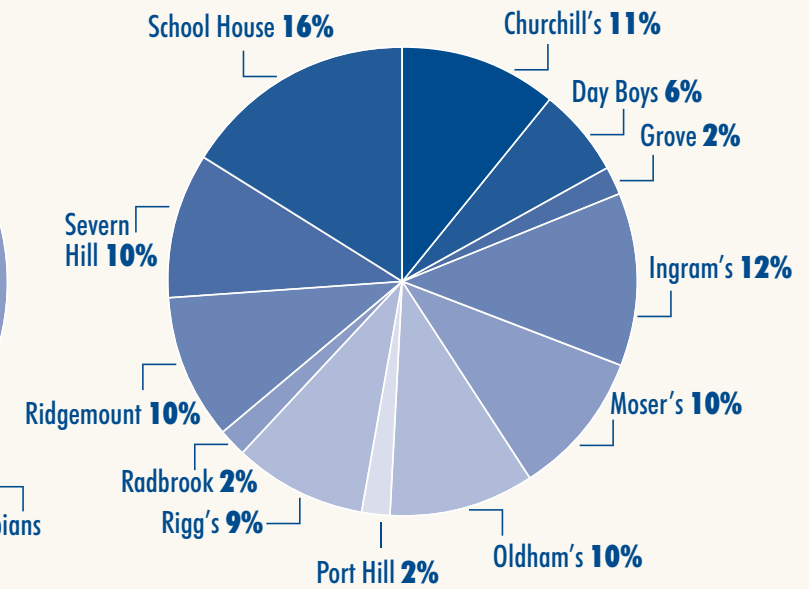
Direction of Pledges & Donations

The total amount given in pledges and donations to the Annual Fund from 1st August 2016 – 31st July 2017 was £632,831. This figure does not include funds raised in the Shrewsbury School Capital campaign.

Capital Project – The Moser Library

The Moser Library, originally opened in 1916, was reopened on Old Salopian Day 2017, following a major programme of refurbishment over the summer months which aimed to provide a modern learning facility while preserving the heritage of the building.

The library now has zoned study spaces, some for individual study and some for group work. Pupils are able to plug in their own computers at the desks to use print and online resources. There is access to 40,000 books, plus e-books, magazines and newspapers. Improved shelving makes books easier to locate and display shelving means that different collections can be highlighted. Comfortable seating in each zone encourages reading for pleasure. An extra room for group study has been created in the Moser Gallery Roof space and is proving popular.

Many thanks to all those whose charitable support was instrumental in enabling this project to take place.

“Most significant is the increased number of students choosing to work in the library. Since we re-opened after the refurbishment we have seen a sustained increase in footfall compared to the same period last year. Since the refurbishment not only are more students coming into the library, but they are staying for longer, working more productively and clearly enjoying the space.”

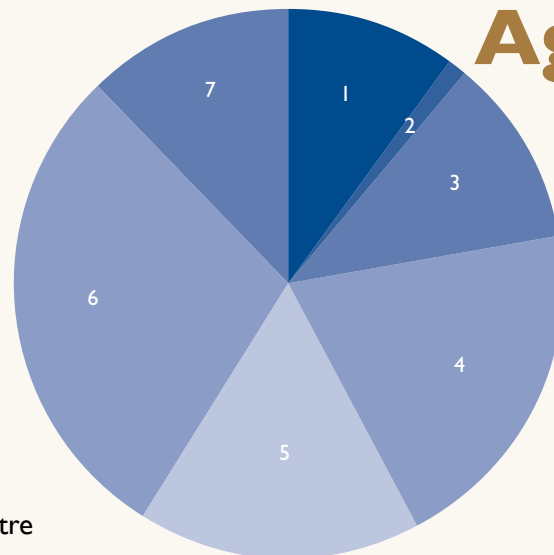

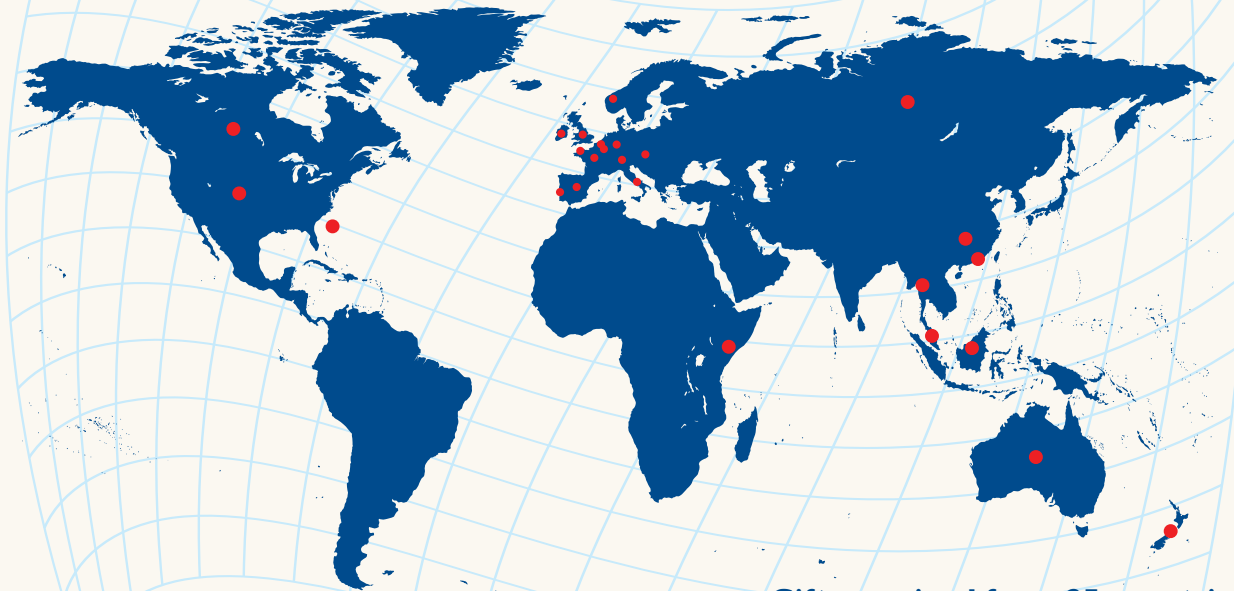

Telephone Campaign

This year the Foundation held its first separate Parents' Campaign. Our student callers telephoned parents of current pupils, raising much needed funds for the refurbishing of the Moser Library, and for bursaries. 330 parents were contacted and £70,000 was raised in the Spring Term.

The Summer Campaign has become an integral part of our Annual Campaign and helps us to maintain contact with our community in the UK and worldwide. Once again it was hugely successful, bringing the total raised by the two campaigns up to almost £200,000. Our team of fourteen committed and enthusiastic sixth formers and recent leavers spoke to 816 Old Salopians and parents, and had many interesting and enjoyable conversations.



Support for Bursaries

Since the founding of the Shrewsbury School Foundation in 1965 bursaries for means tested pupils has been a priority. Bursaries enable bright and talented pupils whose families could not otherwise afford the fees, to attend our fine school. Being awarded a bursary can be a life changing opportunity for a pupil. Besides benefiting the bursary holder the complete fabric of school life is enhanced by their contributions. Each year the Foundation is charged with the responsibility of attracting £550,000 in charitable funding through the Annual Appeal. As parents and Old Salopians know all too well it is only through their combined generosity that the Foundation can meet this challenge. In 2016/17 the Foundation provided £466,000 for 35 pupils, with a fifth of them receiving bursaries worth 90% or more of school fees.

Sir Mark Moody-Stuart (R 1954-59) on why he supports bursaries:

"I am an Old Salopian myself. Living and working in many countries, we needed UK boarding education for our children and Shrewsbury was clearly on the list. My wife Judy was a little sceptical that following in parental academic footsteps should be a basis for choice, being a product of Hove County Grammar School for Girls herself. However, one visit convinced her. Our three sons and six nephews all in turn went to Shrewsbury.

Judy and I are believers in education as a way to bridge the growing gaps in society. Furthermore, private education will not survive if it is not more inclusive. So supporting the bursary programme is important to both of us."

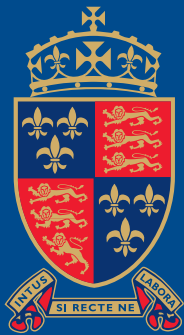
