Shrewsbury School Gala Concert in Birmingham Town Hall, Sunday 18th March at 7.30pm

A reminder that next Sunday, all those who are within reaching distance of Birmingham are warmly invited to come and enjoy an evening of Shrewsbury School Music at its finest and most exciting in the splendour of Birmingham Town Hall.

The first half of the evening features two outstanding soloists: Matthew Poon (I LVI) will perform Lalo's spell-binding first movement of the Symphonie Espagnole for solo violin and orchestra; and Harry Lawrence (O UVI) will play the first movement of Mozart's wonderful Eb Major Horn Concerto no 3. (Harry has just been awarded a place to study the French Horn at the Royal Northern College of Music.)

The major work in the second half of the concert is Mozart's glorious Requiem, when the Symphony Orchestra will be joined by the massed voices of the Shrewsbury School Community and Chapel Choirs, with guest soloists Kathryn Turpin and Jonathan May, who head up the School's Singing Department, tenor Jamie MacDougall, who is currently singing a solo role with Scottish Opera, and Natalie Clifton-Griffith, who sings with some of the country's top professional choirs as well as having a very busy career as a soloist and teacher (and wife of Assistant Director of Music Alex Mason).

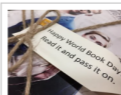
