One of the main parts of this afternoon is the mock interview aspect, which is such a valuable experience for students to make the most of. At some point all of you will have an interview, so here are a few tips.

- a) Structure your responses. For this event, the majority of the questions will be <u>competency</u> themed, a great opportunity to demonstrate your skills, qualities and relevant experiences. To do this in a way that makes sense, you might wish to utilise the <u>STAR</u> approach to your interview answers.
- b) Practice. Practice. Practice. Lower 6<sup>th</sup> are now more familiar with our brilliant interview software (ShortlistMe) and the majority have completed a practice interview. There's a host to choose from on this <u>link</u> which you can access at any time you want, and will help you feel more confident in these situations.
- c) The Headmaster wrote about this <u>topic</u> in 2020, and shared some really useful pointers. He also recommended a quality TV programme which I am old enough to remember!

To conclude, I thought it might be helpful to highlight seven external opportunities which you may wish to consider to coincide with NCW.

- 6) Another site which is worth a visit, particularly for some national work experience placements, is the Student Ladder <u>website</u>. It has a range of different resources, some aimed at university students, others a school pupils.
